RE: ATLANTIC REGION'S 30TH ANNUAL WEEKLONG SCHOOL

 $MAY 24^{TH} - MAY 29^{TH}, 2015$

I am pleased to inform you the 30th Atlantic Region's Annual Weeklong School will take place May 24th – May 29th, 2015 inclusive, at Terra Nova Resort & Golf Community which is located in Port Blandford, Newfoundland. Please note the registration fee has changed from last year to accommodate double or single room occupancy. *The cost for this year's weeklong school (including registration fee, accommodation and meals) is \$750.00 per participant – double room occupancy; and \$1,350.00 per person - single room occupancy.*

Enclosed you will find our Brochure, which includes the National President's message, descriptions of courses being offered, the registration form and other information.

As in previous years, there are scholarships available to members in both provinces and you are encouraged to apply as per the information contained within the brochure.

The four (4) workshops being offered at this year's school are:

- Course #1 OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY Workplace Inspection & Incident Investigation
- Course #2 BUILDING STRONG LOCAL UNIONS
- Course #3 CONFLICT RESOLUTION and
- Course #4 INTRODUCTION TO STEWARDING <u>plus</u> six (6) STEWARD LEARNING SERIES MODULES:
 - 1. Handling Grievances
 - 2. Being an Ally for Equality
 - 3. Handling Discipline and Discharge
 - 4. Conflict Resolution
 - 5. Creating an Accommodation-Friendly Workplace
 - 6. Representing Members in Front of Management.

Registration for the workshops will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. I encourage each Local to make your selection as early as possible and return your registration form along with your post-dated cheque to avoid disappointment. Once a maximum of 20 participants for each workshop have been registered, no further registrations will be accepted. The deadline to register is May 2, 2015.

Please *post-date your registration cheques for May 31, 2015*, which will reduce the chance of your cheque becoming stale dated. Registration cheques are not processed until after the weeklong school has concluded.

When selecting participants for the school, please consider those who are prepared to take an active role in this learning experience and who will abide by the rules and quidelines for conduct and attendance. Please consider members who:

1) actively participate in your Local

2) are willing to be active but could benefit from additional training

3) are willing to share this knowledge with the Local membership and Executive when he/she returns.



GENERAL INFORMATION

This is the 30th Atlantic Regional's Annual Weeklong School. Weeklong School provides community atmosphere where learning, relaxation and fun are combined. The objective is to give CUPE members the opportunity to specialized develop skills programs that are interesting and challenging.

WHO CAN ATTEND?

The School is open to all CUPE members.

Class size will be limited to approximately twenty (20) participants. Participants will be registered on a first-come, first-served basis. It is very important to signify a second choice. Should there be an inadequate number of registrations for a workshop, it will be subject to cancellation.

In the event of a course cancellation, participants will be placed in another workshop. Every effort will be made to place participants in their alternate choice of workshops.

We reserve the right to limit the number of members any one local may send to any workshop and to assign participants to a second choice workshop.

LOCATION

The weeklong school is being held at the Terra Nova Resort & Golf Community located in the town of Port Blandford, on the east coast of Newfoundland and Labrador, and on the eastern edge of Terra Nova National Park. The Resort is just a 2-hour drive from St. John's and just over an hour from Gander.

SCENT FREE ZONE

For the comfort and health of our members and staff, CUPE has implemented a Scent-Free Policy at all of our workshops. Scented products such as hair spray, perfume and deodorant can trigger reactions such as respiratory distress and headaches. Please refrain from using scented products. ARRIVAL TIME



COURSE #1



OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY - WORKPLACE Inspection and Incident Investigation

Inspections are an opportunity to identify and address hazards before they can cause harm to your members. Investigation of incidents allows us to find root causes and identify corrective actions. Brother John Brookfield (Health & Safety Representative - ARO) has developed this workshop to enable your members to implement and participate in these best practices in Health & Safety. This workshop is ideal for members on health and safety committees. members of local executives and those with an interest in improving health and safety conditions workplace. If available, participants should bring their digital camera and laptop computer.



COURSE #2

BUILDING STRONG LOCAL UNIONS

[REVISED]

Strengthen your local; engage and mobilize your members in the context of our political environment. With the right vision, your local can be stronger and more effective for your members and your community.

This workshop covers:

- Internal politics: Issues, problems and solutions that are relevant to your local
- Strategies for making your local more inclusive
- External politics: A political action plan to increase your effectiveness in your community, provincially and federally.



COURSE #3

CONFLICT RESOLUTION

Conflict is a natural part of our lives. Learning to handle it well will improve your relationships with other members, co-workers and the employer.

This workshop will:

- Deepen your understanding of conflict:
- Strengthen your communication skills:
- Provide opportunities to practice responding to conflict.



COURSE #4

INTRODUCTION TO STEWARDING plus SIX (6) STEWARD LEARNING SERIES MODULES

This new combined stewarding program will get new stewards up and running after one week. What does a CUPE Steward do? If you are a new steward and want to learn how to help CUPE Members solve workplace problems, this introductory workshop is for you!

The Introduction to Stewarding portion covers:

- > The role of the steward
- > Investigating workplace problems
- > Filing a grievance
- Meeting with management
- CUPE's structure
- Dealing with workplace complaints.

The Steward Learning Series provides an opportunity for Stewards to explore a number of topics – all from a Steward's point of view. This program also acknowledges the important role Stewards play in the union.

This Weeklong School presents the following modules from the Steward Learning Series:

At this Weeklong School, we will offer:

- 1. Handling Grievances A refresher on basic grievance handling. This module highlights the Steward's role as educator. Participants teach each other "Best Practices" and share strategies for dealing with difficult grievances;
- Being an Ally for Equality -Championing human rights in the workplace and the union is an important role for Stewards. But what does it really mean to be a good ally;
- 3. Handling Discipline and Discharge for many stewards, discipline and discharge cases are the hardest grievances to handle.

Learn about:

- key legal concepts and terms;

- the role of a steward during the employer's investigation; when discipline is given; and during grievance meetings;
- how to develop effective arguments.
- 4. Conflict Resolution Skills for Stewards – Conflict is a natural part of our lives. It often leads to positive change. Knowing how to handle it well will improve your relationships with members and the employer. Learn about the different responses to conflict and practice communication skills that will help in situations of conflict.
- Creating an Accommodation Friendly Workplace – Human rights laws require employers to accommodate workers who face barriers to employment.

This module covers:

- The legal framework for the Duty to Accommodate;
- What a good accommodation process and plan look like;
- What to do if the employer is not willing to provide reasonable accommodation.
- 6. Representing Members in front of Management - Stewards and supervisors are equals when they meet about labour relations. This module equips stewards to be proactive when meeting with management. Learn tips for effective meetings and build confidence by practicing meting situations.

The CUPE Nova Scotia Atlantic Weeklong School Scholarships are awarded by CUPE Nova Scotia. Two Scholarship of \$750.00 are available annually.
